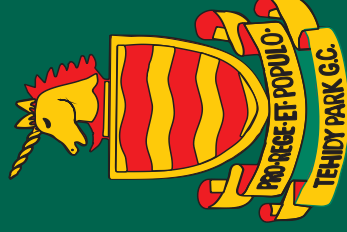


LOCAL RULES

1. OUT OF BOUNDS (Rule 27 and Section II– Definitions)
 - a) On or over any boundary wall, fence, line of white posts or white line defining out of bounds.
 - b) On or over the road on the right of the 6th hole.
 - c) On or over the pathways around the clubhouse, the clubhouse, green keepers area and all car parks.
2. Ground Under Repair
All areas defined by white lines **must** be treated as “Ground Under Repair: Play Prohibited”. If a ball lies in or the area interferes with the players stance or area of intended swing, relief **must** be taken as prescribed in Rule 25-1b.
3. Immovable Obstructions
 - a) All artificial paths, including the sides of paths and the rocky adjacent to the Practice Putting Green are immovable obstructions, relief may be taken under Rule 24–2b(i).
 - b) Individually staked/ protected trees **must** be treated as Immovable Obstructions and relief **must** be taken as prescribed in Rule 24–2b(i).
 - c) A ball played onto the metalled road running East to West across the Course or within one club’s length of it, may be lifted and dropped no nearer the hole, without penalty.
4. Sprinkler Heads and Inspection Covers
All fixed sprinkler heads and inspection covers are immovable obstructions. Relief under Rule 24–2b can also be obtained if the ball lies within two club-lengths of the obstruction and the obstruction intervenes on the line of play between the hole and the ball.
5. The Pump House and surrounding wall at the rear of the 14th green is declared an immovable obstruction and relief **must** be taken as prescribed in Rule 24–2b (i). **In the interests of safety, balls must not be retrieved.**
6. All walls, except boundary walls, are declared integral parts of the course.(Relief may only be taken under Penalty).
7. Stones in bunkers are moveable obstructions. (Rule 24–1 applies).
8. Water Hazards (Rule 26 and Section II– Definitions)
Water Hazards are identified by yellow stakes.
Lateral Water Hazards are identified by red stakes.
Where there are yellow or red lines, these define the margin of the hazard, otherwise the margin is defined as being that point at which the ground breaks downward into the hazard.
9. Swan Manure
Interference by swan manure occurs when the ball lies in or is touching the condition or when such a condition interferes with the player’s stance or area of intended swing. If the ball lies on the putting green, interference also occurs if such condition intervenes on the line of putt. Relief may be taken under Rule 251b.

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
